**Saturday, Oct. 3, 2015**

0010 A female caller wanted to speak with a deputy about doing a welfare check on a male, a 4-year-old female and her father, who live in Nashua. Dispatch transferred her to voicemail as all deputies were out on patrol, and then notified a deputy about the call.

0057 A female caller advised there was a dead deer in the road approximately 16 miles west of Glasgow. A deputy was advised of this call and he patrolled to MM 521 and was unable to locate any dead deer.

0150 The generator alarm went off. It advised a high water temp alarm and a low water level alarm. After several calls, dispatch reached someone who could check this out.

0655 A male caller reported a semi with a double trailer in the underpass that was already pointing south and would not be able to make it through. The caller thought the semi driver might need help backing up. At 0658 an officer advised that the semi got out and was turned around.

0734 A female caller advised the sprinklers at Bundy Park had been on all night. Dispatch notified both the Water Department and Public Works.

1305 A female reported her daughter's vehicle was hit by a semi. She said the semi was parked by Reynolds, but now she can't see it. She said her daughter called her and she called law enforcement when she arrived on scene. An officer was notified at 1306. When he got to the scene, the semi was already gone, so he did not get

a description of it. They did say it was headed east, so the deputy headed that way to see if it was still in the area, but was unable to locate it.

1450 A male caller reported a shoplifter at Shopko. He said it was a female who was in the checkout line right then. She was wearing a hooded sweatshirt, had blond hair in a ponytail and a white purse. He said she stole some hair ties. He would like the officer to meet him outside. At 1454 the caller requested the officer call him on his cell phone, and he was patched up with an officer. At 1528 a male arrived at the window with a bottle of pills for the suspect. Dispatch told him that per policy the suspect couldn't take those pills, but that they would have to come directly from a pharmacy. The PD tried to call Shopko Pharmacy about the suspects pills, but it closed at 1500 hours today. The suspect was charged with possession of dangerous drugs and violation of conditions of release.

1509 A female called about cellular harassment.

1607 The same suspect as in the 1450 call was charged with possession of drug paraphernalia.

1644 A female caller reported a trailer in the underpass that may need help getting out. Officers were notified and advised that the underpass was clear at 1646.

1846 A motor vehicle stop was initiated at the parking lot of the old Trailside building. Two females were in the car, both under 21, with some alcoholic beverages in the vehicle, one of which was open. At 1901, the deputy advised to terminate the 20-minute deprivation period as the driver appeared able to drive

at that time.

1948 A male called wanting another welfare check on his children. He stated the mother left with them without his consent and where they were staying, the phone has been disconnected. He stated his children were 6 and 9 years old. Dispatch advised the caller that this was done last night and that everything was fine. He was told this was a civil issue and he needed to contact his attorney. The caller stated he understood and that he had the paperwork with him, he just hadn't filed it yet. A deputy was advised of this call.

1959 A deputy reported he just saw a white pickup hit the ditch and spin around. The deputy advised not to call MHP as there was no damage to property or the vehicle. He also advised to start a 20-minute deprivation period from the time of the incident and he would be out conducting field sobriety tests with the driver, who was also the registered owner of the vehicle. At 2030 the deputy reported the subject had refused all testing at that time. He was bringing him in and reading the subject implied consent. The subject was a Peerless man, who was charged with DUI, alcohol or drugs.

2001 A female caller wanted an officer to deliver a message to her son that his brother was in the hospital in Minot and to please give her a call. An officer was notified and the message was delivered.

2221 A female caller stated there had been a dog barking since this morning at a location on Heather Lane. Officers were notified.

**Sunday, Oct. 4**

0004 BNSF dispatch called in stating there was a male passed

out by 6th St. and 1st Ave. S. He was approximately 500 yards east of this intersection on the south side of the tracks. Officers were notified that this would be by the 4th St. crossing.

0338 A female caller requested an ambulance for an 18-year-old who was involved in a MVA and had a head injury. The patient was breathing and was conscious at that time. They were holding pressure on the wound.

1135 A male caller wanted to speak with someone about his sister taking property that was his from his mom's property. He said she had the power of attorney for his mom and he was trying to get his stuff off the property, but had the right to work the land in his mom's will as he had been doing. He said he needed this equipment to work cows. He spoke with a deputy who told him this was a civil issue.

1316 A female caller reported her husband left over 30 minutes ago to take their son to the ER, as he had a peanut and he was allergic. She said the vehicle didn't have much gas, so she was worried they may have broken down so she called the ER and they haven't made it yet. She said they would be on Hwy. 2 between Hinsdale and Glasgow in a green Subaru. She said her son did have his Epipen. A deputy who was in Hinsdale was notified and he didn't see a vehicle matching this description when he headed over there. He will head back to Glasgow to see if he can locate the vehicle. He advised there was a vehicle matching this description at McDonald's. By the time they got to town and got gas, the son was fine and wasn't having any type of reaction to the peanut. The caller was notified.

1622 A female caller wanted to know if dispatch could trace a restricted number, and she was told dispatch could not. Dispatch told her to contact her provider and they could possibly do it. The caller said the person calling her was telling her they were going to kill her. When asked if it was a male or female voice, she said they were trying to do what they did in the movie "Scream." She said she didn't find this funny and there were kids in the background where she was calling from. She gave dispatch her first name and hesitated on the last. The caller said she was calling from "one of her houses." Dispatch told her they needed an address so they could determine jurisdiction and she wouldn't say it out herself and call us when she knew. She said if dispatch couldn't trace the call, then it didn't matter. A deputy was notified of the call. At 1948 the caller called back and said she had the phone number of the people calling but didn't know who they were and wanted dispatch to find out. She stated she had spoken to a female who refused to give out her name. The caller said it was her kids who were doing this calling. An officer was advised of this call and he was also given the caller's number.

1658 A female caller advised the vehicle she was driving was just hit in the parking lot of Raider's Quick Stop in Hinsdale. She said she was in town borrowing a car from her brother-in-law's friend, so it wasn't even her vehicle. She said she sort of blocked the suspect vehicle in but she told the driver she was just going to be inside for a minute and asked if he wanted her to move. He told her he did

not, so she went in the store. Her daughter stayed in the vehicle and advised the subject pulled out of the parking lot and hit their vehicle as he was pulling out. The vehicle was a light blue Silverado (she thought) with a possible plate number. Dispatch ran the plate number that didn't match up to the vehicle description. She was patched up with MHP dispatch, and a deputy was notified. The caller said the damage was to the passenger side of her vehicle. She then said she thought it was a Silverado or a Suburban, blue and silver in color. She was told a Silverado was a pickup while a Suburban was an SUV. She advised it definitely was a Suburban. The caller said the driver was a white male in his late 40s to early 50s. She was told she could come and get a white form to send in to MHP and didn't have to stay at the Quick Stop.

1911 A male caller stated there were three people in the parking lot across from the Elks by the light pole next to the Stockman Bar who were yelling and screaming at each other. At 1912 an officer was notified. At 1913, he called back to say they all left and he didn't see where they all went. An officer was advised.

2054 A male caller stated there was a flatbed pickup in front of him with two taillights that looked like headlights, as they were both broken out.
