NOTICE OF APPLICATION AND INTERVENTION DEADLINE

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that on November 30, 2016, Montana-Dakota Utilities Co. ("MDU")
 filed its Application to Implement a Fuel and Purchased Power Cost Tracking Adjustment Rate
 35 ("Application") with the Montana Public Service Commission ("PSC"). MDU is requesting that
 the PSC implement a fuel and purchased power cost tracking adjustment pursuant to the terms
 of its Rate 35. (Rate 35 is a contract rate that currently applies to one customer.)

As a result of Docket D2007.7.79, a fuel and purchased power cost tracker was est-
 ablished for Rate 35 allowing MDU to adjust the base cost of fuel for yearly fluctuations
 in the fuel and purchased power costs. Those fluctuations are required to be tried up on
 an annual basis.

This filing is MDU's annual true-up as a result of the fuel and power cost tracker
 established in D2007.7.79. MDU states it has over collected \$547,878 from its Rate 35
 customers for the period from November 1, 2015 through October 31, 2016. Also included
 is the projected under recovery from rates already established of (\$192,643) for November
 and December of 2016 for a total over recovery of \$355,235.

 Bismarck, ND 58501; the Commission, 1701 Prospect Avenue, P.O. Box 202601, Helena, MT
 59620-2601; and the Montana Consumer Counsel ("MCC"), 111 North Last Chance Gulch,
 Suite 1B, P.O. Box 201703, Helena, MT 59620-1703, telephone (406) 444-2771. The MCC is
 available and may be contacted to assist and represent the interests of the consuming public
 in this matter.

Any interested person who is directly affected by the filing and wants to be a party to this
 proceeding must petition to intervene no later than January 11, 2017. By the intervention
 deadline, a person petitioning for intervention must: (1) Submit the petition electronically (e-
 file) on the PSC's website at <http://psc.mt.gov> ("Account Login/Registration" under "Electronic
 Documents" tab); and (2) physically deliver or mail the original petition to the PSC at 1701
 Prospect Avenue, P.O. Box 202601, Helena, Montana 59620-2601. The PSC will not post an
 e-filed petition to its website until it receives the original from the petitioner. A person petitioning
 for intervention in this docket must also serve a hard copy of the petition on the MCC, at the
 address above, and MDU's attorney, Michael Green, Crowley Fleck PLLP, 900 N. Last Chance
 Gulch, Suite 200, Helena, MT 59601.

An interested person who does not wish to formally intervene in this docket may submit
 written public comments on the matter to the PSC at the above address, or by email to
psc_utilitycomment@mt.gov. A form for making comments may be found at <http://psc.mt.gov>
 (go to "Comment on Proceedings").

The PSC's jurisdiction over this matter is provided at Title 69, MCA. The substantive and
 procedural law applicable is Title 69, MCA, especially Chapter 3, ARM Title 38, Ch. 5 (utilities),
 Title 2, Ch. 4, MCA (MAPA), ARM Title 38, Ch. 2 (PSC procedural rules), and any prior orders
 of the PSC which may bear on the issues presented.
