





While we were in Albertsons, we met another family from Saint Marie. Mike Medora and his wife, Rachel, and their son, Joshua, who live on Spruce Street. Mike mentioned the Boil Water Advisory, and that even though North Valley County Water and Sewer has been testing the water, the water in his home is running a rusty color.

In our SMCA monthly letter, it stated that at the time of the break, the tests came back clear, and at the time of the newsletter, they should be getting the result of later testing and that they will post status change notices as soon as possible. There is still a Boil Water Advisory in place for our

Saint Marie residents. This means that after the water has come to a full rolling boil, boil for at least one minute.

The digging that had been done on Walnut Court was not because of a service break, but there had been seepage into the basement and it was discovered that it was a "new" underground

Then there is still the fire hose across the street to the hydrant and to a resident's home on Pine Street, which is supplying water for that building.

Our condolences goes out to the family and friends of John W McLeod, who passed away on Oct. 1. He was so young and fought a hard battle with a very aggressive form of lung cancer. McCleod not only had worked with the North Valley County Water and Sewer District a few years ago, but also held a job printing with the Glasgow Courier. Again, our condolences to friends and family.

The Saint Marie Fire Department headed up the GHS Homecoming Parade this past Friday afternoon. Last year we were at the Homecoming Parade and really enjoyed it.
