Saturday, June 29

1946 – Reporting party stated there is a vehicle blocking his turn. The reporting party is attempting to move some machinery and cannot make the turn. 1609 – Reporting party wanted to know if anyone turned in a wallet. Dispatch indicated they are not aware of any being turned in. The caller provided information on where it could be but so far no one has seen it. At 1840, the reporting party called back stating she found the wallet.

2218 – Caller reported someone is shooting off fireworks and she needs to get up in the morning. She stated the fireworks are shooting up into the sky.

2245 – Caller stated about 10 minutes ago she saw a man walking in the driving lane of Hwy 24 South. He was possibly intoxicated. A deputy was notified who advised he was unable to locate the male.

Wednesday, July 3

1742 – Reporting party advised he just witnessed a lightning strike south of Fort Peck Lake and just west of Haxby Point. He stated there is a pretty good storm rolling through right now and advised there is quite a bit of smoke coming up with it. It was determined the location was in Garfield so dispatch called their dispatch and they stated they received the same call but was told it was at the Pines. However, that didn't seem right to Valley County Dispatch. 1441 – Caller requested an officer at his residence to have a female removed from the property. Right before the call was dispatched to a deputy, the reporting party disconnected the call. During the call with dispatch, there was yelling in the background. Dispatch attempted the reporting party's number and did not get an answer. At 1523, deputy advised there was not enough evidence for it to be PFMA. Both parties are separated.

1459 – Caller reported a fire behind the Fairgrounds. It was determined to be a slow-moving grass fire and response was

2214 – Reporting party made a complaint of fireworks being shot out in the green area. A second call was received stating the same. Per deputy, it's raining now so there is no fire danger. There also isn't any county ordinance on fireworks.

Saturday, July 6

0012 – A suspicious vehicle was reported. It was determined to be a couple of people chatting. It was asked of them to remove their vehicles as the location is for day use only.

1001 – Alarm Company called in a smoke alarm. They had not yet spoken to anyone at the location. Dispatch called and spoke to the manager, who stated one of the coolers had a short, which set off the detector. The unit is unplugged and there is no need for fire to respond.

1243 – A dog bite was called in. The patient's own dog bit him. The nurse provided a name and DOB, so an email was sent to the Health Department.

1306 – RCSO dispatch called stating they received a call about a car doing in excess of 100 MPH headed west on US Highway 2. The driver had just gone through Oswego when the original caller reported it to RCSO. Deputies and MHP dispatch were notified of the call. The car was caught up to by the deputy and written warnings were provided.

1330 – Caller reported a male and female are outside of the residence screaming and hollering at her mom. She said they are attempting to fight. There are no weapons to her knowledge. Deputy later advised he spoke with the reporting party, who stated this originated at her place and walked over to the other residence. The reporting party is stating the sister is driving around intoxicated and would like her located. At 1403, deputy spoke with the reporting party again who stated there were no threats made. They

are wishing that the suspects be trespassed for the night. The argument was over missing money. Deputy later advised he patrolled and was unable to locate the sister.

Goetz is not the person's real name.

1449 – Reporting party advised she left her bag/wallet in the cart at Albertsons. She stated she tried to call the store but didn't get an answer. A description of the bag and wallet was provided.

1633 – Caller reported he was flagging over by Oswego when a semi freightliner came up behind him doing about 100 MPH and almost rear ended him. A description of travel for the semi was provided. Roosevelt 911 was contacted and advised of the situation.

1754 – A male reported grass fires south of the Spillway along Hwy 24 South. A second caller reported the same, stating the fire is about seven miles south. A third caller reported the same and provided more information, including the fire may have been started by a vehicle dragging a chain. Dispatch notified McCone County and they have also received multiple calls on it. At 1740, a caller reported he realized that a wheel came off his boat trailer and started the fires.

2321 – A public assist call was recorded. A deputy advised there is only one occupant in the car, who is sleeping.

Wednesday, July 10

0104 – Reporting party called and said it wasn't really an emergency, but he had called dispatch and they didn't open until 0800. He needed help getting his vehicle started. Dispatch provided him with the information to contact Glasgow Police Department. At 0110 officer advised the vehicle is up and running.

0111 – Reporting party called stating a pickup kept driving around the hospital and finally parked in the parking lot with its lights turned off. An officer arrived and stated he does not see the truck.

0934 – Reporting party advised that yesterday some people, who she suspects are transients, were hanging out in their gazebo area. She stated this morning she found them sleeping in the road between the old Roosevelt Hotel and the library. They haven't been a problem, they are not littering or anything but she doesn't want them hanging around for days on end. Officer later spoke with the two transients and were told to move on by the end of the day.

1042 – Caller reported a grass fire about two miles north of the US Highway 2/ MT Highway 24N intersection. She stated the grass on the side of the road is on fire. Two more calls were also received with the same information. The cause of the fire appeared to be a vehicle that lost a tire. Registered owner of the vehicle was notified.

1122 – Reporting party called to advise her daughter-in-law lost her keys. A description of the lanyard was provided.

1201 – A public assist call was recorded. The semi appeared to have broken down.

1219 – Reporting party called in about a motor vehicle accident. She states someone just hit her parked vehicle. A description of both vehicles were provided.

1609 – Caller reported that a vehicle passed them headed eastbound doing about 90 MPH. The occupants threw out a full case of Bud Light that hit the caller's vehicle.
