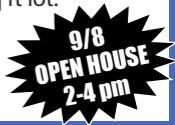

Automated License Plate Reader system: As defined at § 46-5-117(3)(b), MCA, a device principally designed and primarily used for determining the ownership of a motor vehicle, the mileage or route traveled by a motor vehicle, the location or identity of a motor vehicle, or the identity of a motor vehicle's occupants on the public highways, as defined in 60-1-103, MCA, through the use of a camera or other imaging device or any other device, including but not limited to a transponder, cellular telephone, global positioning satellite, automated electronic toll collection system, automated license plate recognition system, or radio frequency identification device that by itself or in conjunction with other devices or information can be used to determine the ownership of a motor vehicle or the identity of a motor vehicle's occupants or the mileage, location, or route traveled by the motor vehicle.

Access to ALPR data is restricted to authorized personnel in furtherance of a criminal justice purpose. ALPR data may be shared by an authorized user of the database with another law enforcement agency as defined by § 44-11-303(1), MCA. Any other use of this data is strictly forbidden. When ALPR data is made accessible to or otherwise shared with or transferred to another law enforcement agency, the agency that collected the ALPR data shall document the identity of the other agency and the specific officer(s) or civilian employee(s) of that agency who were provided the information.

Utilizing funds provided through our federal law enforcement partners and in cooperation with Roosevelt County, Fort Peck Tribal Council, and Fort Peck Tribal Law Enforcement two license plate readers were recently acquired. Installation of the ALPRs will occur along the US HWY 2 Corridor near Frazer, Montana and Brockton, Montana.
