0058 hours. The camera also shows the neighbor came out asking what he was doing there and the guy said he was looking for someone. The guy was advised no one was living there by that name, which at that point the male got in his truck and left. Dispatch informed the reporting party as soon as an officer comes on shift, they will be notified of the call.

0940 – A female came in looking to see if dispatch had any keys turned in. She stated she lost them in August, possibly at the fairground, but was not sure.

1048-A male called in stating they had done some work on a combine, the owner came and picked it up. The combine then lost the hydraulic fluid on the highway. They have put floor dry on the fluid but there is blockage on the highway and they will be towing the combine back to the shop. He would like an officer to come out and check the situation to make sure everything is okay or provide traffic control. Officer arrived and confirmed the combine is blocking the right lane, however believes the blockage is obvious to other drivers.


