



ects includes cold in-place recycle of the existing pavement followed by application of a new overlay, upgraded pavement marking, signage and guardrail at bridge ends. Additionally, the

asphalt will be removed from the bridge decks over Timber Creek and Nelson Creek followed by application of a new deck seal and cover.

Typically, pavement preservation projects of this size and scope are advanced to construction as soon as possible, generally within two to three years. An

actual target construction date will be determined based on the anticipated completion of all design activities and when funding can be allocated.

The purpose of these projects is to extend the existing pavement life and provide a safer, smoother riding surface. No new right-ofway or utility relocations will be needed.




