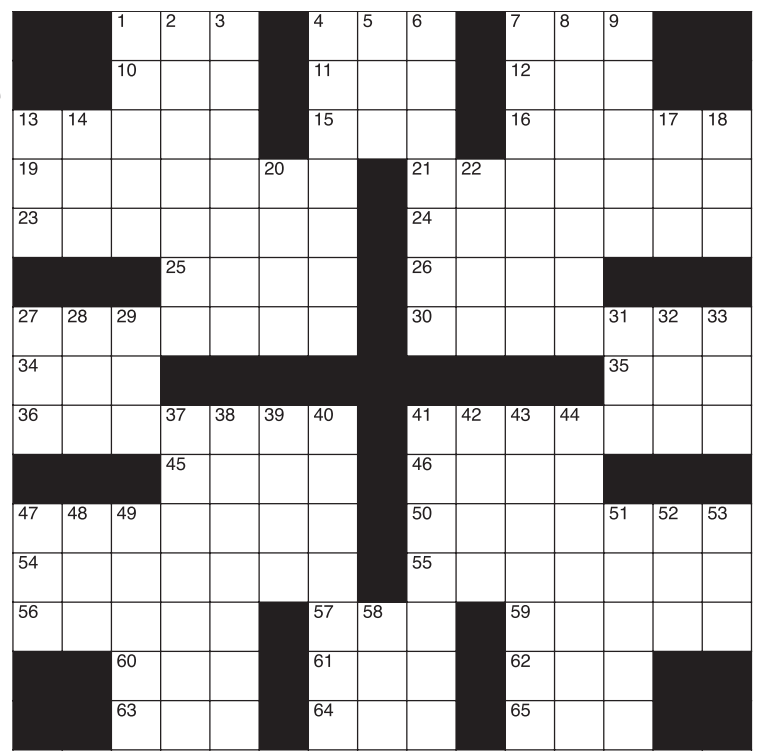

MDT Proposes Delineation Project on U.S. Highway 2

The Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) would like to notify the public and seek comments on a proposal to install new standard delineation on about four miles of U.S. Highway 2 east of Glasgow.
